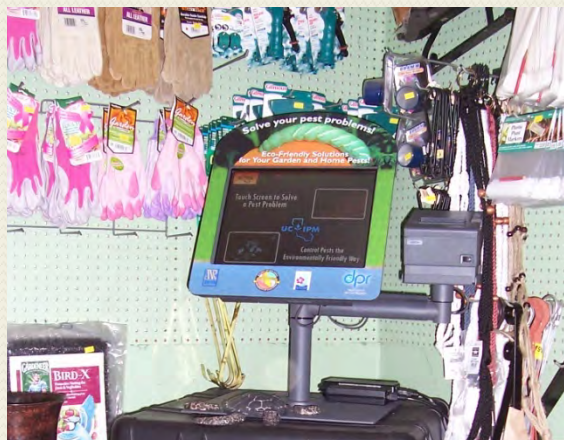



Plant Pathology Laboratory

The Plant Pathology/Nematology Laboratory provides plant diagnostic services to the local agricultural industry and the general public. The laboratory is an important source of accurate, unbiased information on plant diseases caused by nematodes (microscopic worms) and other plant pathogens such as fungi, viruses and bacteria.

Approximately 8,000 samples are processed annually by the laboratory, with more than one-half coming from nursery stock imported into the county under quarantine. Staff also survey for problems in nurseries and other farms to prevent widespread infestations of uncommon diseases or to meet requirements for exportation of agricultural products outside the county.

Guidelines for Submitting a Sample

1. The sample should be as fresh and complete as possible; with examples of soil, roots, stem and leaves. When this is not possible, as with trees or a lawn, a picture can be helpful.
2. The sample should be representative of the symptoms, in the diseased or dying stage but not completely dead. Once a plant is dead, microorganisms that decay organic matter start to grow, making it difficult to isolate what originally caused the plant to die.
3. The sample should not be too large or too small. Pieces the size of an arm's length or smaller can be worked on in the laboratory. When a sample consists of only a few leaves or pieces of bark, it is difficult to make a good diagnosis.
4. Samples should be taken before treatment with any pesticides. Pesticides prevent growth of insects and pathogens and may prevent us from finding the cause of the problem.
5. You may bring the sample to [either office](#) along with a [Specimen For Determination](#) form. This form is also available at the office.

Processing time for determinations:
The average time for return of the diagnosis is 1-2 weeks. Individual samples may take more or less time, depending upon the pathogens involved.

Guidelines for submitting an insect to the Entomology Lab:

Residents are encouraged to submit unfamiliar insects to the lab for identification. These samples are often how AWM personnel become aware of exotic pests in San Diego County. Please submit clean, intact samples, preserved in alcohol if possible. If not, a small container will do. Avoid submitting samples on tape, or which have been squashed.

Bring the sample to one of our offices and fill out a [Specimen For Determination](#) form. [Click here for office addresses and phone numbers](#). You may also print out a form and mail it, with the sample, to either office.

Please allow 2 weeks for determination. The results will be mailed to the address you provide. Please ensure that you have COMPLETELY and LEGIBLY filled out the address portion of the form.

If you suspect you have Red Imported Fire Ant, please call (800)200-2337 to request a RIFA submission kit.

Please also be aware that our Lab does not currently have the specialized equipment or staffing expertise to respond to issues associated with pet or human health. Please contact your local veterinarian or health care

Vector Control Program

The San Diego County Vector Control Program (VCP) is a countywide program that monitors vectors and the diseases that they carry. A "vector" is an animal or insect capable of transmitting the causative agent of human disease. "Vector" also includes **eye gnats**. Some examples of vectors in San Diego County are **mosquitoes, ticks, and rodents**. The VCP has been reducing and controlling mosquitoes since the 1930's.

The VCP:

1. Protects public health by surveying for diseases carried by vectors.
2. Reduces peoples' exposure to vectors and human diseases.
3. Responds to public requests for vector inspections.
4. Educates the public about mosquitoes and other vectors to help residents protect themselves from the diseases vectors can carry.



A Brief History

Although South Bay Botanic Garden was officially established in January of 2008, its history really began in 1974. As a new college horticulture program, the garden started as an empty field, one greenhouse, and no plants. However, through the efforts of countless students learning the skills of planting and hardscape installation, the garden has grown into a park-like setting of hundreds of different varieties of plants.



A member of the [American Public Garden Association \(APGA\)](#), the South Bay Botanic Garden consists of 4 acres of trees, shrubs, flowers, ground covers, various turfgrasses, plant collections, and water features all framed in a pleasant setting. As part of the [Landscape and Nursery Technology Program at Southwestern College](#), the garden continues to be a learning facility for students pursuing degrees in the horticultural fields. Don't be surprised to see a group of students working on the garden or learning a horticultural skill.

The garden is located on the Southwestern College campus in eastern Chula Vista, about 8 miles from the Pacific Ocean to the west and 5 miles from the Mexican border to the south. We are located about 20 minutes from downtown San Diego. Our climate enjoys the cooling effect of the nearby Pacific Ocean but is inland far enough to receive consistent sunshine.

The South Bay Botanic Garden is overseen by a group of dedicated volunteers that help to determine the direction of the garden. They organize activities, hold volunteer work days, and provide input as to the goals and future direction of the garden.
