Area of Origin & Plant Types

- Native to Europe, Asia, Africa, Australia, plus America tropic and subtropic regions
- Thrives in San Diego climate
- These plants can be classified under the dicot flowering plants
- Bisexual with a cluster of 5 pedals resembling a star

Common Traits

- Flowers are often showy and fragrant
- Usually in clusters of 5
- Most plants or parts of this plant are usually poisonous
- Milky latex sap
