

Getting to know Erythrina

A.k.a. the Cockspur Coral Tree...

*Beautiful, colorful flowers *Attracts birds and butterflies * Hardy Drought tolerant *Resistant to cold weather



* Argentina's national flower and LA's official city tree

* Deciduous tree or shrub (Can reach up to 50ft.)

* Commonly cultivated, becoming widely naturalized, especially in coastal districts along drains & streams.

- *Leaves: Compound trifoliate leaves with prickles on stems.
- *Flowers: Very large spikes of bright scarlet or coral-red pea like bird attracting flowers in Spring-Summer.
- *Fruit: Long green pods age brown and open with a twist revealing large, hard, bean like seeds.







BEWARE!

Erythrina has a dark side...

- *Commonly considered a tree weed. Can quickly become a weed.
- *Roots: Substantial tap and lateral root system capable of invading plumbing pipes.
- Will sucker from root fragments left in ground. Branches left on the ground can re-grow into new plants.



The dark side...continues

- * Lays dormant during the cold season and sprouts up in Spring.
- * Very difficult to control.
- * Has the potential to invade natural areas such as hind-dunes, rainforests, wetlands creeks, and saltmarshes.
- * Removal of this species is recommended.
