
## **APOCYNACEASE**: Flowering Plants

- Members of flowering plants that include over 400 genera.
- The leaves are usually milky and the flowers are mostly in five flower clusters.
- These particular plants have fruit; usually with a dry pod that splits open when mature.

# **APOCYNACEASE**: Flowering Plants

#### Other species are:

- Nerium (Oleander)
- Pachypodium (African Succulents)
- Frangipani (Plumeria)



## ASCLEPIAS (Milkweed)

- This particular plant is known as "Milkweed."
- There are approximately 140 species of this particular family.
- Milkweed has a milky sap and contains cardenolides.
- Milkweed is essential for pollination to take place by bees, and more importantly by butterflies.
- Milkweed is the main food source for Monarch butterflies

# Asclepias curassavica


- Asclepias curassavica is referred to as:
- Scarlet Milkweed
- Tropical Milkweed
- Bloodflower
- Red Asclepias

#### Asclepias curassavica

- This milkweed species has a woody based plant with stiff stems and narrow leaves.
- The plant grows to approximately 3 feet tall and 2 feet wide.
- This species is also documented in Florida, Hawaii, Louisiana, Tennessee, Texas, as well as California.

# Asclepias curassavica

- Other characteristics of this species are:
- Drought Tolerant
- Soil Types Loam and Sand
- Native to Mexico, Central America, and South America
- Sometimes Invasive
  - NO MILKWEED.....NO MONARCH

- Showy Milkweed (Asclepias speciosa)

- Mexican Whorled Milkweed (Asclepias fascicularis)
- Desert Milkweed (Asclepias erosa)
