## Common Name-Hong Kong Orchid Tree

Common Name: Hong King Orchid Tree

Family: Fabaceae

Genus: Bauhinia (A genus of >500 species)

Species: Bauhinia × blakeana; Pronunciation: bah-HIN-ee-uh blay-kee-AY-nuh

Plant type: Legume family/Tree

They usually are sterile- rarely produces fruit or seeds

Propagation is by grafting, cuttings & air-layering

**History:** Although now cultivated in many areas, it originated in Hong Kong in 1880. (It is believed that all cultivated trees derive from one cultivated at the Hong Kong Botanical Gardens and widely planted in Hong Kong starting in 1914.)

The flag of Hong Kong features a distinctive five-petal white flower on a red background. This flower became Hong Kong's emblem when the territory was handed over to China in 1997







Grows: 12-24" per year

Height: 20-40' at maturity

Width: 20-25' at maturity

Life expectancy: 40-150 years

## Flower appearance:

**Color:** Pink, purple, or rose (5-6" across-larger than other bauhinia)

Fragrance: Yes

Bloom season: Early November to late March

They are said to resemble butterflies





**Foliage appearance:** 

**Shape:** Lobed and palmate

Color: Gray green

Bark: Light or dark gray

Partly deciduous at bloom time





## **Additional considerations:**

- Enjoys full sun to partial shade
- Enjoys moist soil (loam or sand)\*
- Does not tolerate of frost\*
- Prefers highly acidic to slightly alkaline soil
- Susceptible to aphids (but free of serious pests and diseases)
- Considered low risk for root damage
- Attracts birds
- Although no fruit it can be messy
